



# Activity: Types of Identification (ID)

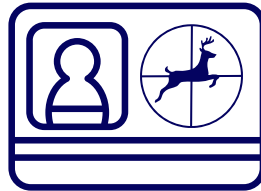
## Option 1: One Piece Required

An elector may vote by mail or iVote after uploading one piece of identification issued by the Government of Yukon, the Government of Canada, or a municipality.

The identification must show the elector's name and current residential address.

2) Fishing Licence



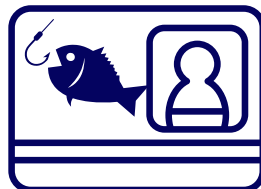
3) General Identification Card

# Activity: Types of Identification (ID)

## Option 2: Two Pieces Required

An elector may vote by mail or iVote (voting online) after uploading two pieces of identification that are satisfactory to the Chief Electoral Officer.

Both pieces must show the name and one must show the current residential address.

Match the examples with their names.

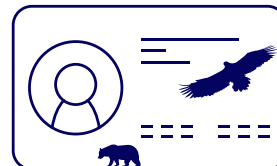
1) Employee Identification

3) Mortgage or Lease Agreement



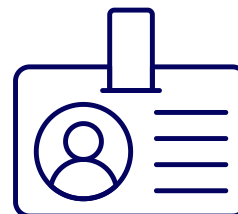
4) Passport

# Activity: Types of Identification (ID)

## Option 3: Attestations

Attestations prove ID and address for electors who cannot provide other types of ID. These are issued by a service provider.

Match the service provider with their description

1) Care Centre Electors	Correctional institution
2) Electors Without a Fixed Address	Property Manager or Owner
3) Hospitalized Electors	Facilities that provide meals, services, or accommodations
4) Tenant Electors	Seniors Residences, Assisted Living Communities, etc.
5) Incarcerated Electors	Hospitals and Health Centres



# Activity: Types of Identification (ID)

## Option 4: Vouching

An elector who is unable to provide ID may vote by naming a vouching elector.

A vouching elector can only vouch for one elector and they must be on the List of Electors.

Example: My neighbour, Luke

## Option 5: Declaration of Alternate Proof of Residential Address

Electors can prove their address by using an approved declaration form.

They are available at polling locations.
