You can vote in an election in the Yukon if you are:

- 18 or older
- A Canadian citizen
- have lived in the Yukon for at least 12 months

Why vote?

Here are some key points to remember about voting in the Yukon:

- All Yukoners who are at least 18 or older are eligible to vote.

Register to Vote



To vote, you must be on the Elector's list. This list contains the names and addresses of registered electors. It is used to administer elections and to make sure you get a voter information card in the mail when an election is called. The voter information card will tell you when and where to vote.
