# A Territorial General Election Has Been Called

A territorial election has been called for Monday, November 3, 2025.

Yukoners are voting to elect 21 Members of the Legislative Assembly. Each Member represents an electoral district (also known as a riding or constituency) and has a seat in the Yukon Legislative Assembly.

For the first time in over 100 years, Yukoners will also vote in a **plebiscite**. Electors will be asked if they want to keep the current first past the post voting system or change to a ranked vote system.

## Voter Eligibility

To vote in the territorial election, you must be an eligible voter in the Yukon:



Be at least 18 years of age as of the polling day.



Be a Canadian citizen.



Have been a Yukon resident for at least 12 months as of polling day.

## Register to Vote



To vote in a Yukon territorial election, you must be registered to vote. Registration is used to confirm your eligibility and to assign you to a polling division in your electoral district.

You can register, check or update your registration online at [electionsyukon.ca](https://electionsyukon.ca). Registered electors will receive a Voter Information Card with information on where and when to vote. It will make your experience at the poll faster and more convenient. You can also register when you vote.

If you are registering for the first time or updating your information, you will need to upload ID that shows your name and address. Your ID must match your registration. Most people use their Yukon driver's license or general identification card, but there are 50+ ID options.

# Ways to Vote

## Vote by Special Ballot

---

All electors have the option to vote by special ballot. Electors who wish to vote by special ballot can apply at any Returning Office, online at [electionsyukon.ca](https://electionsyukon.ca), at another pop-up opportunity, or by phone at (867) 667-8683 or 1-866-668-8683 (toll free in the Yukon). Electors are reminded and encouraged to apply at the earliest opportunity, before the application period ends on **October 31**.

After October 31, special ballots can be returned to the Returning Office in your electoral district or dropped off at Elections Yukon Headquarters in Whitehorse or at the Whitehorse drop box (outside the Jim Smith Building – 2701 2nd Ave) until polls close at 8PM on **November 3**. Any ballots received after polls close will not be counted.

## Vote at an Advance Poll

---

Advance polling will be available **Sunday, October 26** and **Monday, October 27**. Advance polls will be open from 8AM to 8PM.

Electors can vote at any advance poll in their electoral district. A list of advance poll locations will be available online at [electionsyukon.ca](https://electionsyukon.ca).

## Vote at the Advance Territorial Poll

---

An advance (territorial) polling place will be available at the Whitehorse Elk Lodge (401 Hawkins St). This is a special additional poll where electors from any electoral district in the Yukon can vote in person. This special poll is primarily intended to serve electors who are in Whitehorse and who may not otherwise be able to vote, but it is available to all electors.

## Vote on Polling Day

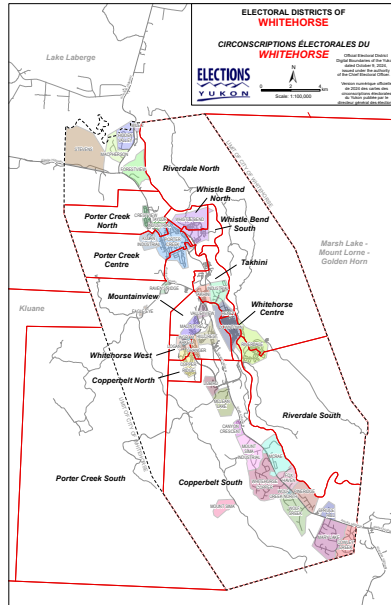
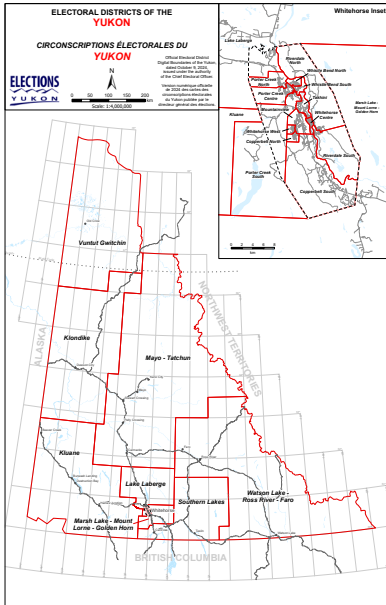

Polling Day is **Monday, November 3**. Polls will be open from 8AM to 8PM.

New for this election, electors can register and vote at any polling place in their electoral district. This allows electors to be served on a first-come, first-served basis and makes voting faster and easier. Polling places will be listed on your Voter Information Card (VIC). Where mail delivery is not possible, digital VICs and 'Where Do I Vote?' information will be available online at [electionsyukon.ca](https://electionsyukon.ca).

# New Electoral Districts

There are two new electoral districts for this election. There are now 21 electoral districts (up from 19) and many district boundaries and names have changed. To check your electoral district, go to [electionsyukon.ca/find-my-electoral-district](https://electionsyukon.ca/find-my-electoral-district).

# Make a Plan to Vote

## Check your Registration

---

Register, check, or update your information online at [electionsyukon.ca](https://electionsyukon.ca), or by phone at (867) 667-8683 or 1-866-668-8683 (toll free in the Yukon).

All electors must be registered to vote in the election and plebiscite. Online voter registration closes on **Friday, October 24**, but you can also register in person when you vote at an advance poll or on polling day.

## Find your Electoral District

---

There are two new electoral districts, and many districts have new boundaries and names. To check your electoral district, go to [electionsyukon.ca/find-my-electoral-district](https://electionsyukon.ca/find-my-electoral-district). You can enter your address to find your electoral district.

## Learn about the Candidates and Plebiscite Choices

A list of candidates running in your electoral district will be available at [electionsyukon.ca](https://electionsyukon.ca).

In addition to choosing their Member of the Yukon Legislative Assembly (MLA), electors will be asked if they want to keep the current first past the post voting system or change to a ranked vote system.

More information about your plebiscite choices is available at [electionsyukon.ca/plebiscite](https://electionsyukon.ca/plebiscite). Electors are encouraged to seek out balanced and accurate information before making their decision.

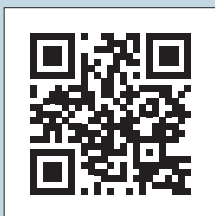
