- General Identification Card

- Trapping License

- Any other identification card issued by a Canadian government (Federal, Territorial, Yukon First Nation, or local), with name and current address of residence or mailing address

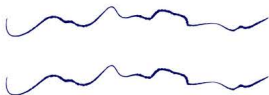
Authorized Identification

Option 2:

Authorized Identification

- Bank statement or personal cheque
- Birth certificate
- Burning permit
- Camping permit
- Canadian Air Transportation Security Agency (CATSA) card
- Canadian Blood Services card
- Canadian Border Services Agency Passenger Accelerated Service System (CANPASS) card
- Canadian Border Services Agency Free and Secure Trade (FAST) card
- Canadian Border Services Agency Nexus card
- Canadian Forces Civilian identification card
- Canadian Forces Health or identification card
- Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) identification card
- Certificate, diploma, or transcript issued by a school, college, or university
- Certificate of Indian Status Card
- Charitable donation tax receipt

Option 2:

Authorized Identification

- Canadian citizenship card
- Credit card statement
- Credit or debit card
- Employee identification card or payroll statement
- First Nation Citizenship card
- First Nation Government identification card
- Government benefits statement or cheque stub (employment insurance, old age security, social assistance, disability support, child tax benefit, etc.)
- Health services identification band (patient wrist band)
- Income tax document (assessment, etc.)
- Insurance policy or coverage card (home or vehicle)
- Lease agreement or accommodation bill
- Letter from the Chief or Registrar of a First Nation Government
- Library card
- Marriage certificate

Option 2:

Authorized Identification

- Membership card (health club, political party, retail outlet, etc.)
- Mortgage document or statement
- Old Age Security card
- Canadian Passport
- Foreign state Passport (if dual citizenship)
- Pension plan statement of benefits or contributions
- Prescription Medicine Container
- Pleasure Craft Operator card (PCOC)
- Possession and Acquisition (Firearms) license
- Property tax assessment
- Residential services invoice (yard or home services, etc.)
- Social Insurance card or paper
- Student identification card or correspondence from a school, university, or college
- Utility bill (fuel, phone, internet, power, etc.)
- Veteran's Affairs Canada Health card
- Voter Information Card (current election)

Option 3:

Attestations

Attestations can be used to establish identity and residential addresses for electors who may be unable to provide other types of identification.

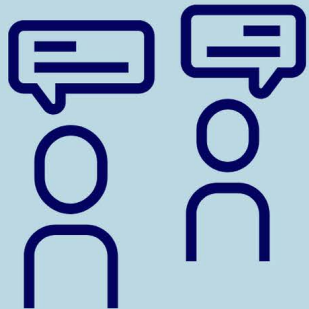
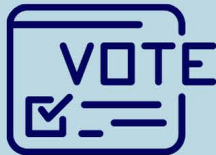
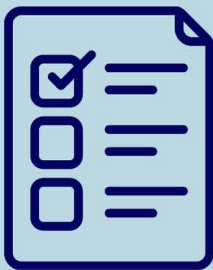

Option 4:

Vouching

An elector who is unable to provide authorized identification may vote at a polling station during Advance and Polling Day polls by appointing a vouching elector whose name appears on the List of Electors for their electoral district.

A vouching elector is restricted to vouching for one elector



Option 5:

Declaration of Alternate Proof of Residential Address

An elector who proves identity and establishes the elector's name by providing identification authorized under Option 1, Option 2, and Option 3A may prove the elector's place of residence by making a declaration in writing in a form approved by the Chief Electoral Officer.
